As I write this brief article, I am on the island of Puerto Rico with a team of 15 other Americans from

six different US states to spread the gospel message in booklet form with whoever will listen. We are laboring in a collaborative effort with Bearing Precious Seed, Oshkosh, and Wings As Eagles to distribute gospels of John and Romans in several different cities in Puerto Rico. The man previously mentioned was one of about 15,000 individuals that have received a gospel booklet over the first several days of the campaign. This is part of the E.P.I.C. (Evangelizing People In the Caribbean) winter/spring outreach 2025. We have several more trips planned throughout the next couple of months, and some even still have open team member slots. Belarus 1995

Traveling for a ministry like Couriers for Christ can be difficult with children. Long hours of travel; schooling in the van, hotels, parks, people's homes, churches; constantly being put in the position of meeting new people; and going to different Sunday school classes were all challenges our children faced. Of course, there were lots of positives also. They had lots fun adventures in making new friends, seeing sites in many different states, and going on an occasional trip overseas.

With all the stateside travel we wanted them to have an opportunity to really experience the mission field and understand the why of what we were doing. That opportunity was opened to us in 1995 when Missionary Mark Rose planned a summer of ministry in Belarus and invited several people to join him and his family.

Our five children ranged from grade school age (10) to college age (22). Two more young people joined us, Josh Stertz from our ministry and Cara Christensen from a supporting church in Minnesota.

The experience we had that summer was priceless. We all experienced the difficulties and joys of living on a foreign mission field. The nine of us lived in a small apartment in a high-rise apartment complex in Minsk. We learned to do our grocery shopping





while traveling on the buses, trams, and trains to get out to the village where the Roses had their church. All this was done without the benefit of speaking the language, and at that time very few of the people we met were able to speak English. In spite of the language barrier our boys got out and tried to teach baseball to some of the children in the apartment complex. The kids loved it, all of them!

Working alongside the missionary families we were split up, going to do ministry in different villages with the intention of reaching people with the gospel and starting more Bible studies. We did a combination VBS/tent meeting in a soccer field, distributed tracts, cleaned and helped update a small hospital, did some building projects, dug a well by hand, and developed a love for ministry and missionaries.

Today Josh, Cara, and all our children are either in full time ministry or heavily involved in their churches. Our family was able to go because of a small inheritance from my grandfather. It was an eternal investment and one that is still paying dividends in terms of lives touched and souls saved. I'd encourage you to pray about how you can be involved in missions.

Praying...giving...going. It will change lives, yours and others.
