UPDATE: from the 'Front Lines'

By the time you read this article, our team of 40 Americans from 10 US states will be back home with family and friends. As I type this article, I am sitting at the desk in my hotel room here in Germany. It has been a wonderful trip working with missionaries Patrick and Christelle Jobway and folks from their two churches. The Lord gave our team the strength to distribute over 70,000 German John and Romans in about one dozen cities in and around Stuttgart. You will read several articles about this trip in the upcoming Couriers newsletters, but I have asked our team to share what their impressions of this trip have been. I am blessed by the things that the Lord has done in their lives while they are here in Europe away from their homes and routines.

"As an introvert and a pastor's wife, I am always forced outside of my bubble in many ways in the ministry. Many people equate being outgoing and vocal as being a good Christian. Of course, we must be willing to do anything God wants, but being a part of this campaign has helped reinforce that God uses all types of people to do his work. It's okay to be a quiet person...most days I was by myself or with my daughter or one other lady quietly walking the streets and spreading the word of God. I truly felt like a farmer walking the field and sowing the seed. I am happy to have been a small part of the work. To be used of God in any capacity is truly amazing."
